"Finally, all of you, live in harmony with one another; be sympathetic, love as brothers, be compassionate and humble. Do not repay evil with evil or insult with insult, but with blessing, because to this you were called so that you may inherit a blessing." 1 Peter 3:8&9

On Sunday, March 13 we hosted the church Bible Drill Competition and over 30 children between the ages of 6 and 18 participated. Once again the congregation was blessed, encouraged, and challenged by the scripture memory and Bible knowledge demonstrated by our students. The question crossed my mind; 'How much would it benefit our congregation to memorize scripture on a regular basis?' The Psalmist saw the benefits of memorizing God's word, meditating upon it, walking according to its teachings, obeying and loving it. He recognized the word's power to bring salvation, revive a weary soul, give a young person wisdom and valued it more than thousands of coins of gold and silver. PAUL'S ADMONITION, CHRIST'S EXAMPLE

"Do everything without murmuring or complaining." Philippians 2:14

I don't know about you, but Paul really stinks it up for me when he gives these blunt, little instructions. I sometimes like to think that I'm in touch with God's expectations on a grander scale; you know, the "big ones" like His will for my life, faith during times of trial, etc. But when you break things down to the nitpicky construct of my personal character, I'd just as well prefer to turn a blind eye and hope that no one really takes notice. After all, we all have our weaknesses, right? The problem with that mentality is that Someone does notice.

Over the course of my life, I have made many decisions based on what others might think. My humanity begs that I never appear weak or incapable. What a challenge that Christ has called me to humility – to embrace my frailty and weakness before Him, to take up my cross and follow Him, to die to myself. Unfortunately, my tendencies are quite the opposite – to hide my weaknesses, to pretend no cross is involved, to "live it up" in accordance with my desires.

I'm convinced this is a shared struggle. What's more, it is likely the primary reason for the condition of the modern day church – powerless. At least from a Kingdom perspective.

Life in 2011 offers variety and speed on all fronts. Instant gratification has, perhaps, become the most detrimental attribute of society. We seem to screen our every desire and decision with convenience, which, by definition, is a self-serving notion – a notion that brings with it unreasonable expectations and recurring temptations. Burger King says, "Have it your way." McDonald's says, "I'm lovin' it." The world says, "I'm offerin' it." And all too often I respond with, "I'm takin' it." It's when I don't get it my way and/or when I'm not lovin' it and/or when I'm not "pleased" with my "options" that I begin to murmur and complain. I'm a whiner. And increasingly ashamed of it.

An often starved, body-beaten, jail-frequenting, isolation-bearing Paul tells us to do everything without murmuring and complaining. He didn't simply instruct us not to murmur and complain, lest we succumb to the temptation to remove ourselves from troublesome circumstances as a copout. Rather, he tells us to do EVERYthing to their exclusion.

More notable is Christ. The One who bore inexplicable agony as payment for our sin. Who followed His Father-led journey even unto death. Who exemplified obedience, humility and selflessness to the extreme. This is our shame. Yet this is our glory. Our only hope.

So, as Easter approaches and we look to the cross, may we not wallow in our self-serving fancies. May we not live for convenience. May we not even give consideration to ourselves. For God will supply our every need according to His riches in glory. Everything else (the non-needs) serve as the very temptation that will lure us away from that which He has called us to be. Holy. Set apart. Worthy of Him.

May the power of His presence not be a foreign matter of mystique or forgotten relevance, rather the very centerpiece of our lives of worship and obedience unto His majesty. May He not be reduced to a distant being whom we approach on our terms, rather enthroned as the one true living Almighty God who reigns eternal above all else and others.

In a seek-ye-first-your-own-agenda kind of world, may we seek first His Kingdom and His righteousness, knowing all the while that He will take care of the "other things." In a world where qualities like abandonment and surrender are sure signs of foolishness, may His people take on the nature of their Savior, who "humbled Himself and became obedient unto death – even death on a cross, "while not once offering a word of complaint. Herein is love.


