The home is recognized in its rightful place in the lives of children. Students are taught to respect their parents, love them, and obey them. Loyalty for church and respect for ministers are encouraged. Christian schools attempt to inspire love of country and respect for civil government.

Christian schools equip students with basic academic skills (their students achieve well above national norms of standardized achievement tests). ## Behavioral Guidelines

At Heritage Christian School, we believe that the principles found in the Bible should govern our behavior, both in and out of school. In order to promote an atmosphere that honors the Lord, we have instituted policies, rules and procedures that govern behavior. Some of these reflect Biblical convictions. Others reflect our desire to establish standards that avoid the appearance of evil and enable us to maintain testimonies that are above reproach. Still others are included in order that we may be courteous and respectful of others and their belongings and /or to simply do all things decently and in order.

Specifically, students are encouraged to incorporate habits in their lives that stimulate spiritual growth, including regular church attendance, Bible reading and study, consistent prayer and Christian service in our homes and communities. Students are not permitted to use alcoholic beverages, non-medical drugs or tobacco. Immorality, including pre-marital sex and homosexuality, are forbidden by the Word of God and are grounds for dismissal from HCS. Students must separate from worldly influences, such as movies containing ungodly philosophy and content, pornographic literature, and immodest behavior and dress associated with the world's philosophy. Bad attitudes are not tolerated, including attitudes of distrust, dishonesty, selfishness, damaging criticism, disrespect, unethical conduct, bullying, demeaning and harassing attitudes and irreverence. Students are expected to maintain this kind of behavior both on and off campus. Those who consistently disregard these guidelines may lose their privilege of re-rollment or may be dismissed from school.

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## Christian Conciliation Agreement

The parties to this agreement are Christian and believe that the Bible commands them to make every effort to live at peace and to resolve disputes with each other in private or within the Christian community in conformity with the biblical injunction of **1 Cor. 6:1-8**, **Matt. 5:23-34**, and **Matt. 18:15-20**. Therefore, the parties agree that any claim or dispute arising out of, or related to, this agreement or to any aspect of the employment relationship, including statutory claims, shall be settled by biblically based mediation.

If resolution of the dispute and reconciliation do not result from mediation, the matter shall then be submitted to a panel of three independent and objective arbitrators for binding arbitration. Each party to the agreement shall have the right to select one arbitrator (unless the parties mutually agree to the use of only one arbitrator). The two arbitrators selected by the parties shall jointly select the neutral, third arbitrator. If there is an impasse in the selection of the third arbitrator, the Institute for Christian Conciliation division of Peacemaker Ministries of Billings, Montana [(406) 256-1583] shall be asked to provide the name of a qualified person who will serve in that capacity. The mediation and arbitration process shall be conducted in accordance with the "Rules of Procedure for Christian Conciliation" contained in the Peacemaker Ministries Booklet, *Guidelines for Christian Conciliation*.

The parties agree that these methods shall be the sole remedy for any controversy or claim arising out of the school relationship or this agreement and expressly waive their right to file a lawsuit against one another in any civil court for such disputes, except to enforce a legally binding arbitration decision.

Each party, regardless of the outcome of the matter, agrees to bear the cost of his/her/its own arbitrator and one-half of the fees and costs of the neutral arbitrator and any other arbitration expenses. (If the parties mutually agree to use only one arbitrator, each party shall bear the cost of one-half of the fees, costs, and other arbitration expenses).

# Heritage Christian School

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## School Profile

I. **Description:** Heritage Christian School, an independent Christian School, offers a quality liberal arts education for students from Kindergarten through eighth grades along with a licensed preschool for three and four-year-olds. HCS serves Christian families from a five-county area representing more than fifty-five local churches.

II. **History:** Harrison County, West Virginia, has been served by Heritage Christian School since 1996 when HCS was formed by a group of parents who united their vision and efforts to establish a community Christian school. Charles and Marilyn Stout purchased the main facility, formerly the Bridgeport Middle School building, at auction in the spring of 1996. HCS leased the facility from them the first year of operation. In June 1997, the Board of Directors purchased the facility from the Stouts.

III. **Affiliation:** Heritage Christian School is a member of the Association of Christian Schools, International. The HCS preschool is also licensed with the WV Department of Human Resources.

IV. **Academics:** Students excel academically. A number of students place in local, regional and state science and social studies fairs, music and art adjudications, speech contests and writing endeavors. In an effort to minister to the whole child, spiritually, scholastically and relationally, HCS presents a balanced approach to its class offerings with music, band, strings, art, physical education, computer classes and ministry opportunities provided in addition to traditional core subjects. Textbooks from ABeka, Bob Jones, ACSI, Praise Hymn, Shurley English and others are utilized.

V. **Standardized Testing:** As a member of the Association of Christian Schools, International, Heritage Christian School participates in the standardized testing program using the Stanford 10 Achievement Test from K-5 through Grade 8. Average scores are well above local, state and national norms and have hovered near the 80<sup>th</sup> percentile. The Otis-Lennon School Ability Test is given on alternate years. The Hannah Orleans Algebra test is given to select middle school students.

VI. **School Year:** The academic year consists of 180 days of instruction divided into four nine-week grading periods. The school day for the middle school program has eight class periods, each of which is about 45 minutes in length. HCS aligns with the Harrison County Schools calendar year when it can do so. Students report to school by 7:45 and are dismissed at 2:50.

VII. **Faculty:** All full-time faculty of Heritage Christian School hold a degree in the field in which they teach and are state or ACSI certified. All are committed to the Lord Jesus Christ and are active in a local church. HCS faculty members have an average of 9.9 years of experience with an average tenure at HCS of 4.2 years. The school employs a staff of ten full and six part-time teachers along with a support staff of eleven, including an administrator, assistant administrator/teacher, preschool director/teacher, two administrative assistants, a bookkeeper, a paid hot lunch staff of three, two custodians, two teacher aides, one coach and one

after-school care provider; the teacher to student ratio average is 1 to 9. As in most schools, the majority of the internal public is white female with an average age between 30 and 50 years old. Sixty-nine percent of the teaching staff have Bachelor's degrees; nineteen percent have Master's degrees. Thirty percent of the staff has four or fewer years of teaching experience

VIII. **Values:** Heritage Christian School teaches the values and principles of the Bible to govern the personal lives within the family and other social settings. Traditional cultural values are taught; students are encouraged to take an interest in civic and legislative affairs as good citizens.

IX. **Non-Discrimination:** Heritage Christian School, Inc., admits students of any race, color, sex, or national and ethnic origin to all the rights, privileges, programs, and activities generally accorded or made available to students at the school. It does not discriminate on the basis of race, color, sex, or national and ethnic origin in administration of its educational policies, admissions policies, scholarship programs, athletic and other school-administered programs

X. **Finance:** Heritage Christian School is a 501 C3 non-profit tax-exempt entity. HCS does not receive any public funds for the operation of the school program. Heritage Christian is financed largely through the payment of tuition by parents, by the commitment and support of Faith Christian Fellowship, Bible Fellowship Church, Abundant Life Church and Horizons Church, through facility rentals, fundraising and through gifts and contributions.

XI. **Campus:** Heritage Christian consists of one classroom building and a regulation-size gymnasium. The campus is situated on Newton Avenue in Bridgeport, West Virginia. HCS operates a closed campus atmosphere. Visitors gain access to the school's buildings through doors that are monitored via video and audio technology and have buzzer and key card entry. Visitors must first report to the school office; students may not leave the campus without parental permission.

XII. **Athletics:** Track, cross-country, girls volleyball and boys basketball are offered as part of the middle school program. Staff and middle school students who are under staff supervision have access to the school's weight and fitness room.

XIII. **Programming:** Weekly chapel services are built around such annual spiritual themes as "Developing a Heart for God," "Walking in Blessing," and "Fight the Good Fight of Faith." HCS seeks to provide students with practical ministry opportunities so that they may invest themselves in their homes, churches, and communities. Musicals, Christmas programs and spring concerts provide additional opportunities for students to share their God-given talents and faith and to grow in their appreciation of the arts. Middle school students annually attend a retreat. Students are also afforded opportunities to focus on a variety of special topics and to participate in local and state competitions.

XIV. **Administration:** Heritage Christian School operates under the leadership Of Linda Simms, Administrator, Jim Storms, Assistant Administrator and Lisa Cobb, Preschool Director. A twelve-member Board of Directors, whose membership consists primarily of parents, governs the school.

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## 2010 Summer Care Fees (Rates are reviewed annually and are subject to change.)

### **Application Fee** (Applied to first payment)

\$25 per family per summer

### **Cost**

\$23 per day per child (first child)

\$17 per day each additional child

Fees are assessed for all enrolled and drop-in days (exception: holidays) whether the student is present or not. (i.e. families will pay for sick days and family vacation days even when they are absent from summer care if they had registered/enrolled in summer care for those days.)

Lunches and snacks are provided by the child's family; HCS will provide beverages.

## General Information

Heritage Christian School neither solicits nor accepts government funding of any type; therefore, it is imperative that fees be paid when due. By policy, all school accounts, (tuition, hot lunch, after school care, summer care etc.) must be kept current in order for students to continue their enrollment at HCS.

### **Payment Plans**

1. Pay in full for the entire summer on June 1st. There are no discounts for early payment.
2. Monthly Payments. – Families are billed by HCS on the 1<sup>st</sup> and 15<sup>th</sup> of each month.
3. Refund Policy - Heritage Christian School will refund overpayments exceeding \$1.00 unless directed otherwise.

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## Immunization Requirements

*Students may be provisionally enrolled in Pre-Kindergarten with at least one dose of each required vaccine and allowed up to eight months to obtain up-to-date status.*

**Tuberculin (TB) Skin Test** -WV School Law 16-3D-3 states that all students transferring from a school located outside the state of West Virginia or enrolling for the first time from outside the state, shall furnish record of a TB skin test done with the result read and evaluated within the past four months prior to admittance to school. West Virginia School Law does not provide for religious or philosophical exemptions to this test.

## Birth Certificate

Students must have a birth certificate that is certified by the West Virginia State Department of Vital Statistics in order to enroll in any school in West Virginia. If born outside the state of West Virginia, a certified birth certificate is required from the respective state. Hospital and county certificates do not meet this requirement.
