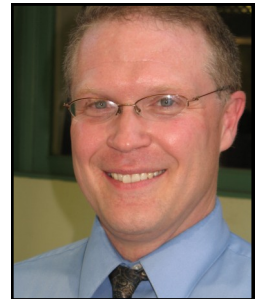

relationship and trust – so slow down."

# One Great Hour of Sharing

In his final moments with his disciples, the Good Shepherd asks Peter, “Do you love me?” “Yes,” Peter replies. Then, “Feed my lambs,” Jesus tells him. “Tend my sheep.” Three times, Jesus passionately repeats his instruction, pressing his followers: If you love me, take care of the people I love. (*John 21:15-19*)

The members of the family of God, including those in parts of the world we may never visit, are God’s flock, the sheep of God’s pasture (*Ezekiel 34:31*). Yet, God’s flock is often forcefully scattered as people are chased from their homes and livelihoods by brutal expressions of war, or as communities are blasted by natural disasters, or as societies and countries are ground down by unrelenting hunger, disease, and poverty.

On March 14<sup>th</sup>, you’ll have an opportunity to offer your gift to One Great Hour of Sharing, empowering the United Church of Christ to offer disaster relief and refugee aid, meeting basic needs in Christ’s name throughout the world. Soon, each of us will have the opportunity to decide how to participate in an offering that helps strengthen people to improve their own lives and communities.

## THROUGH ONE GREAT HOUR OF SHARING:

- disaster victims quickly receive shelter, food, water, and medical supplies
- local communities develop secure sources of food and clean water

- minds and bodies grow stronger with new schools and medical clinics
- refugees receive housing and long-term help to construct new lives
- women and communities are empowered through micro-credit loans and community development opportunities.

In challenging times, we often wonder how much we can afford to sacrifice to help feed Jesus’ beloved sheep, when our needs remain pressing. Perhaps only through prayer can we decide how to respond to Jesus’ call to feed His Sheep. Remember the feeding of the 5,000: when Jesus asked the disciples to feed the hungry crowd, the disciples despaired (Mark 6:34-44). The five loaves and two fish seemed insignificant compared to the massive need. Yet when each gave sacrificially from what they had, through God’s blessing, their gifts turned into a miracle of compassion for all.

Through One Great Hour of Sharing, our gifts meet compelling needs, while also bringing the blessing of compassion into our own lives. The current economic situation is challenging for many of us. For many others, it has pushed beyond challenging to be life-threatening. I intend to increase my gift this year, and encourage you to consider doing so, also. Heed Jesus’ call to feed his sheep with a generous, even sacrificial, gift to One Great Hour of Sharing. Sharing your resources, you’ll change lives — including your own.

On January 31, we held the fiscal meeting of the congregation. To tell you the truth, I was very concerned about how the congregation was going to deal with the budget, as we were foreseeing a deficit and had to make very difficult decisions. As it turned out, the congregation had a very good discussion on how to work on the budget together. It took all of us together to think about where we could cut costs and it took all of us together to think about where we could make sacrifices to get what we want.

One of the ideas that was presented in the congregational meeting was that we could save if we could distribute our FOCUS newsletter electronically. If we did this, we could save on the cost of the paper, printing and postage. We could save the cost of the labor needed to fold, label and transport the newsletter to the post office. We could also be helping the environment, as we will save the trees that are needed to produce the paper. So here's the plan that the Church Council decided on doing. Beginning with the April issue of the FOCUS, we will not be printing and

mailing it out via the post office (snail mail). It will be posted on the church website at [www.whucc.info](http://www.whucc.info). I would also like to share that during the congregational meeting on January 31<sup>st</sup>, we decided that we all would look at our pledges. We were informed that we could eliminate the deficit amount by increasing our pledges by 17%. We have already received a number of pledge increases and even a couple of new pledges. In an Ash Wednesday ritual last week, Pastor Craig asked each one of us to write a few words describing an issue that brings us grief because we lack greater accomplishment in that area of our lives. We burned these small pieces of paper into ashes and mixed them with mineral oil. The mixture was used to mark the forehead or hand of each person as a reminder of the places we fall short in our lives and want to do better. Also important to the recognition of our shortcomings was the spoken assurance that GOD/LOVE is always within the individual.

This period of time, Lent, before Easter helps us to reflect more deeply about our shadow side and, for me, recognize my joys and gratitudes more fully as well.

The notion of risk has come to dwell with me. In the rains of this winter I see more clearly how risky it is to live on the hillsides where the fires last year denuded the botanical growth. I've been noticing the strong young bodies of the Olympic participants. How often I have marveled at how much risk they have faced in their quest for athletic excellence.

I rejoice and am thrilled at the risk that each of us embraces as we agree to a trusting relationship with another person. Whether an adult or child, we risk to love – to make life more whole.

Woodland Hills Community Church is a special place that promises to provide personal and corporate support and affirmation as well as opportunities. The people of WHCC try to consciously provide higher and broader goals than most secular folks do. We are called by Jesus' teaching to do that. We try to be kind to each other *all* the time. 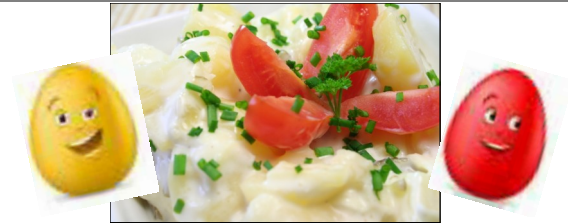

# A Great Outpouring, UCC Members Continue Haiti Fundraising Efforts

The overwhelming outpouring of generosity from United Church of Christ members and congregations to earthquake-ravaged Haiti continues to set new standards, according to church leaders. As of noon Tuesday (Jan. 26), more than \$560,000 had been raised by the UCC Haiti Earthquake Relief Fund, according to Susan M. Sanders, UCC's minister for global sharing of resources.

"The total of \$566,246 includes \$359,245 that has been raised through online contributions," says Sanders. The two-week total is more than double the \$250,603 raised during the first six days following the Jan. 12 disaster.
